## TRILLIUM UPDATE

Trillium's mission: Transforming lives of people in need by providing ready access to quality care.

Although the mission is simple, Trillium's efforts to accomplish this mission are not.

Trillium as well as all MCO's face continuous changes. Recurring budget cuts from the state and federal governments and proposed Medicaid reform cause us to adapt and evolve in order for us to continue to meet our contractual and regulatory obligations.



## Trillium prepares for Medicaid Reform

- On November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2017, Trillium announced an important step towards securing our position as a leader in Managed Care in North Carolina.
- Trillium is working with two other MCO's, Alliance Behavioral Health and Vaya Health to form a new coalition known as Advancing NC Whole Health.

 This is a partnership-not a merger. Trillium believes by aligning our strengths and shared experiences, we can maximize our impact as we prepare for Medicaid Reform.



## Who We Were Last Fiscal Year

- 24 counties, stretching from Virginia to SC
  - Largest LME/MCO in terms of number of counties and geography
- Total population of 1,260,828; approximately 185K
   Medicaid eligible
- 13% of State's total population, 13% of Medicaid enrollees
- 11,451.3 square miles, roughly the size of Maryland, or bigger than 8 states!
- Widely varying population density
  - Wilmington and Greenville are 8th and 10th largest cities, respectively
  - Most of catchment area very rural includes NC's 2 lowest populated counties, Hyde and Tyrrell

## TRILLIUM ADDRESSES OPIOID CRISIS

 North Carolina has received \$31million over the next two years to address the Opioid Crisis through the Cures Act.

– Trillium's allocation for the first year is \$1.2 million. The funding is designated for new individuals seeking opioid treatment for the first time or individuals who have been out of treatment and are ready to seek treatment again.



## OPIOID CRISIS CONTINUED

 As of December, Trillium has spent all of the 1.2 million dollars serving approximately 1269 new consumers.

 Many counties have held their Opioid Forums that have focused on Education, Prevention and Treatment



## TRILLIUM'S OPIOID INITIATIVES

- Healing Transitions in Raleigh 354 admissions from the Trillium catchment who are looking for long term, peer led treatment for substance use disorders
- Oxford Houses 242 people served in sober living homes including women and children.
- NC Harm Reduction over 2245 kits distributed in the Trillium Catchment area
- Wellness Cities in Greenville, Wilmington, and New Bern provide peer support services to hundreds in recovery.

## Reinvestment Plan Outcomes Con't

## **Evidence-Based Services and Supports**

2. DirectCourse Workforce Development

Training of non-licensed healthcare providers to reduce staff turnover and improve patient care. 647 Staff have completed all course work.

- 3. Compassion Reaction/Rachel's Challenge Offered in 289 schools and 136,000 children participated.
- 4. Wellness Recovery Action Planning

Classes that help adults with mental illness learn to manage symptoms, achieve recovery, and live independently.

5. Mental Health First Aid Training
There are 2 classes- Adolescent and Adult that are offered to community stakeholders.

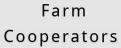

Camp staff, local public safety departments and other county agencies will provide participants with opportunities for pro-social involvement and mentoring.

20849	NAME OF COMPONENT: Community Service BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Provides youth offenders with positive consequences to negative behavior based on court ordered requirements thus holding them accountable for their actions. Victim restitution and community service is an effective program for reducing recidivism. Juveniles are provided a constructive supervised work environment where they may fulfill the requirements of their diversion plan/contract or court order.

20850	NAME OF COMPONENT: C.R.O.W.N. Kids & B.E.A.R.S. BRIEF DESCRIPTION: An interpersonal skill building component where youth increase life skills development, social skills, and have positive interactions with others during school hours, after school, and during school holiday/breaks. Skills sessions also offer opportunities for modeling of appropriate social interactions and practice of skills that have been taught.

Upon successful completion, the referring agency is notified. Teen Court is a diversion resource for juvenile intake, district court, SROs and other local law enforcement.

NAME OF COMPONENT:	Teen Court

**1. Statement of the Problem:** In concise terminology, describe how the program will address continuum need(s) in the county.

Although Camden County has had very few adjudicated youth in the past several years, there may still be youth whose disruptive and anti-social behaviors need to be addressed. Teen Court is a diversionary alternative to juvenile intake and district court.

**2. Target Population:** Describe the target population, including age, and the steps taken to insure that the target population is served.

Camden County youth between the ages of 11 - 17, attending school full-time, who commit a first-time, qualifying misdemeanor and admit guilt are eligible to participate in this program, by referral.

3. Program Goal(s): Provide a brief statement to describe the overall purpose of the program.

This program will hold first-time juvenile offenders accountable for their actions through creative sentencing and positive peer pressure without permanently affecting their record.

- **4. Measurable Objective(s):** State in measurable terms (%) the intended effect of the program on specific undisciplined and/or delinquent behaviors. Example: anticipated reductions in court referrals, runaway behavior, disruptive behavior at school, anticipated improved school attendance and academic achievement. These objectives must include impact on participants.
- 75% Clients successfully/satisfactorily completing the program will have no new complaints in the 12 months following completion.
- 75% Clients will demonstrate improvement in developing and/or maintaining social and interpersonal interactions during program participation.
- 75% Clients will successfully or satisfactorily complete services as intended by the program design/service plan.
- 75% Clients will have no new complaints with an offense date after the admission date.
- 75% Clients successfully/satisfactorily completing the program will have no new adjudications in the 12 months following completion.
- 75% Clients will have no new adjudications for a complaint with an offense date after the admission date.
- **5. Elevated Risks and Needs:** Describe how you will address one or more of the Elevated Risk and Needs of adjudicated juveniles listed in the local JCPC Request for Proposal.

Teen Court will address the risk factor of negative peer groups by requiring all defendants to be trained for and participate as members of the Teen Court Jury for future cases. Positive peer associations will be promoted by providing participants with the positive peer interactions with student volunteers (jurors, attorney, court officers, etc.). School behavior problems will be addressed by referring the defendant to the C.R.O.W.N. Kids program, upon completion of the Teen Court Sentence.

NAME OF COMPONENT:	Teen Court

1. Location: List physical address(es) and describe where program services are delivered.

Teen Court trainings/meetings may be held at either Camden Middle School, 248 Scotland Road, Camden, NC 27921, Camden High School, 103 US Highway 158 East, Camden, NC 27921 or at the Camden County Courthouse Complex at 117 North NC Highway 343, Camden, NC 27921. Initial youth/parent visits will take place at the Camden County Sheriff's Office or if necessary at the youth's home by appointment.

2. Operation: Describe the daily/weekly schedule of program operation.

The Program Coordinator works Monday - Friday, 8 AM to 5 PM. Program operation will be determined on a case by case basis.

**3. Staff Positions:** Describe paid or volunteer position qualifications, (certifications, degrees, work experience) and position(s) responsibilities relative to this component.

The JCPC Program Coordinator (full-time) prefers a Bachelor's degree in human services, or related field and minimal experience working with juveniles and at-risk youth, or equivalent combination of education and experience. A valid NC Driver's License in required.

The Program Coordinator is responsible for the following:

- \* Work in conjunction with SRO's at all County Schools
- \* Recruit and trains all Teen Volunteers (jurors, attorneys, clerks, bailiffs)
- \* Recruit adult volunteers to assist with component and teen court competition teams.
- \* Accept/process referrals, case management, CTF Tracking and client follow-up
- \* Reserve courtroom, schedule presiding judge, and prepare volunteers for court.
- 4. Service Type SPEP: Describe implementation to include:

This program is a STRUCTURE ONLY.

**5. Admission Process:** Describe the specific referral, screening, admission process (including timeline), the staff responsible for making decisions about admissions and reasons why a referral may not be accepted.

The Program Coordinator will accept and review referrals from Court Counselors, SRO's, and school officials. An admission visit will be arranged with the juvenile and their parent/guardian(s) to explain program details, rules and scheduling. A referral may not be accepted if the parent/guardian refuses to allow their child to participate upon which the referral source would be notified immediately.

**6. Termination Process:** Describe the termination process to include the staff responsible for making decisions and the criteria for a successful termination, satisfactory termination, unsuccessful completion and non-compliant termination.

Referral sources and parent/guardian(s) will be notified by the Program Coordinator upon a participant's termination from the program.

A successful or satisfactory termination will result when a juvenile has completed all Teen Court sentence requirements with no or relatively few problems.

SECTION IV	COMPONENT NARRATIVE (attach for each component)
NAME OF COMPONENT:	Teen Court

An unsuccessful termination will result if a juvenile fails to complete all necessary sentence mandates during the time allowed.

A non-compliant termination will result when a juvenile and/or parent/guardian(s) refuses to participate in the program, as specified during the initial admissions visit.

How is the referring agency involved with the termination process?

The referring agency will be notified of all successful and satisfactory terminations after the fact. The referring agency will be notified before an unsuccessful or non-compliant termination is processed, and advised that the juvenile will be turned over to the referral source for further action, as necessary.

**7. Referring Agency Interaction:** Describe the interaction with juvenile court counselors and/or other referring agencies including how client progress will be communicated.

Referring agencies will be taught how to complete the Camden Youth Services Referral Form. The Program Coordinator will be available for all referral sources to call, email, or visit to answer questions or address concerns. Referrals may be mailed, e-mailed, faxed or delivered in person. Contact with referral sources will be on going throughout the duration of the youth's involvement in the program. DJJ referrals will receive monthly progress reports.

**8. Intervention/Treatment:** Describe specifically what the component will do to redirect inappropriate youth behavior or how the component will address the identified needs of the youth and family. What interventions will typically be utilized in this component and how will parents/guardians be involved?

Teen Court will provide defendants the opportunity to accept responsibility for their actions and to give back to the community through the completion of their constructive sentences. Learning that you will be held accountable for your actions gives youth the skills to recognize their choices and evaluate their behaviors. There are children in Camden County that lack the social and interpersonal skills necessary to foster self-discipline and positive behaviors at home and in the community. These children are often left unattended during summer vacation from school and may lack necessary adult supervision. Camp BLUE will address the need for enrichment and skill building services in the summer months targeting juveniles with identified risk factors such as school behavior problems, academic failure or attendance issues, negative peer associations, and parental supervision challenges.

**2. Target Population:** Describe the target population, including age, and the steps taken to insure that the target population is served.

Camden County youth ages 6 to 17 (youth must have completed kindergarten and not graduate high school) are eligible for service. Youth ages 6 to 12 will be campers and youth ages 13 to 17 will be teen leaders in training. Priority placement will be given to those who exhibit at-risk behaviors as described above and/or those referred to the program from juvenile court counselors, SROs, school staff, parents or other community agencies.

Program participants will be provided with adult supervision and enrichment activities for 6 weeks during summer vacation from school. Participants will obtain life skills including communication skills, problem solving, impulse control and other vital social skills, have opportunities to participate in a Challenge-style day camp program where law enforcement, EMS and local first responders are regular volunteers to the program. Weekly and culminating enrichment activities will also reinforce skills obtained throughout the curriculum.

The Day Camp will operate Monday - Friday from 9 AM to 3 PM for approximately 6 consecutive weeks beginning early July and ending mid-August. Camp BLUE will provide a daily schedule of skills sessions and enrichment activities that will build upon itself every week through completion. The curriculum for Camp BLUE may come from a number of varied sources, however, all curriculum will be delivered in a cognitive and experiential manner: 1) Staff teach a new skill; 2) Staff model the new skill; 3) Campers practice the new skill; and 4) Campers transfer the knowledge to practical situations within the camp setting, at home, school and within the community.

The position of Camden Youth Services Program Coordinator (paid full-time) prefers a Bachelor's degree in human services, or related field and some experience with juveniles and at-risk youth, or equivalent combination of education and experience.

Staff positions: Day Camp will be administered by the Program Coordinator and 2 paid staff positions, all of which must have a valid NC Driver's License and be certified in First Aid and CPR. Camp Counselors must be at least 21 years of age.

The Program Coordinator will work to plan/coordinate all camp activities, hire/train counselors, enter and track all client information into NC Allies and ensure the safe implementation of all camp activities. They will interface regularly with parents to exchange information and provide status updates on participants. The camp staff will implement educational lessons daily, responsible for the care and supervision of the youth assigned to their group, act as a positive role model for youth, and adhere to the daily schedule as stated by the Program Coordinator.

Applications will not be accepted if the youth referred has been removed from this program in the past for inappropriate behavior or causing an unsafe atmosphere within the program. A screening committee may be convened as appropriate such as when the program is nearing capacity and additional referrals are received to determine which referrals should be prioritized. Any referral from Juvenile Court will be given priority. Juveniles referred should have demonstrated relevant risk factors or problem behaviors and be committed to participate.

The program is housed in the Camden Sheriff's Office, under the supervision of the County Sheriff. Therefore, this program will have the ability to utilize the resources of law enforcement and other government agencies as volunteers and mentors to the program. All curriculum presented will be age-appropriate and delivered utilizing the experiential learning model which is a cognitive approach. With the use of these resources, as well as others, the program will provide participants with a short-term intense summer experience that will challenge and provide opportunities to strengthen life skills development through physical challenge, curriculum, citizenship, leadership and community service activities. Participants who learn and strengthen life skills and participate in a group environment will be able to work together as a team and re-direct inappropriate behavior. The Program Coordinator will work with clients, their parents/guardian(s), and their school to identify any issue(s) that may need to be addressed per individual.

Camp BLUE is based on experiencial learning theory which is a cognitive approach to skill internalization. Community service/victim restitution is a needed service for diverted, Level I and II adjudicated juveniles, and is a sentencing option regularly utilized by the Juvenile Court to hold youth offenders accountable for their actions. This program will serve the juvenile offenders in Camden County so they will have local assignments to complete court ordered community service requirements, when ordered. The program may also serve diverted juveniles as referred.

Camden County youth between the ages of 6-17 are eligible to participate in the program upon referral.

Kids upon the completion of their requirements in order to maintain the positive focus and to surround the youth with positive peers.

Community service has been found to be an effective juvenile justice program made slightly more effective by adding behavior management elements in the contract. Satisfactory terminations will result when a juvenile has participated and improved, and either become involved in other after school activities (sports/club/job) that prohibit group participation, or is removed after receiving a full dose of service.

Unsuccessful completion will result when a juvenile enrolled in the program demonstrates no improvement in behavior or attitude at home, at school, or in the community.

A non-compliant termination will result when a juvenile routinely fails to participate in offered programs & activities. How is the referring agency involved with the termination process?

A referring entity as well as parent/guardian will be notified of termination and a copy of the written termination summary will be provided.

**7. Referring Agency Interaction:** Describe the interaction with juvenile court counselors and/or other referring agencies including how client progress will be communicated.

Referring agencies will be gathered annually to discuss the upcoming program year and provide input/feedback. A discussion of the Camden Youth Services Referral process and paperwork will occur after the September JCPC Meeting. The Program Coordinator will be available for referral sources to call, email, or visit to answer questions or address the duration of the juvenile's involvement in the program. Regular monthly updates will be provided per policy, and random contact will occur as needed.

**8. Intervention/Treatment:** Describe specifically what the component will do to redirect inappropriate youth behavior or how the component will address the identified needs of the youth and family. What interventions will typically be utilized in this component and how will parents/guardians be involved?

This program is housed in the Camden County Sheriff's Office, under the supervision of the County Sheriff. Therefore, the program will endeavor to utilize the research-based resources and information from juvenile justice and law enforcement to develop the highest quality programming. Being housed within the sheriff's office will offer opportunities for officer and emergency personnel to interact with juveniles in a positive manner. With the use of these resources, as well as others, the program will provide the participants with opportunities to strengthen life skill development through curriculum, citizenship, leadership and community service activities. Participants who learn and strengthen life skills and participate in a group environment will be able to work together as a team and redirect inappropriate behavior. The Program Coordinator will work with clients, their parent/guardian(s) and their school to identify any issue(s) that may need to be addressed for each individual.

NAME OF COMPONENT:	C.R.O.W.N. Kids & B.E.A.R.S.	

This program was originally based on the Edna McConnel Clark Foundation's "Mentoring Programs for Youth Development: A Synthesis," a study of youth mentoring programs. It has further devloped into a social skills program with a cognitive approach that teaches, models, and practices necessary life skills that help juveniles to make better decisions and function within the law and at their highest potential. Mentoring is one component of a comprehensive intervention, according to the Clark Foundation study, and the Coordinator is regularly interacting with participants and modeling appropriate socialization skills. Warm and close friendships with caring adults, supervision and positive role models are the common resources and investments that mentoring intervention contributes to youth development. As stated above, all curriculum will be presented in an age-appropriate and hands-on learning style, delivered utilizing the experiential learning model. Human Relations Media is one of the resources used in social skills development.

### SECTION V Terms of Agreement

This section of the JCPC Program Application will ONLY be completed if approved for funding and will be included in the required JCPC Program Agreement document for completion.

This Agreement is entered into by and between Department of Public Safety, (hereinafter referred to as the DPS), and County, (hereinafter referred to as the County), the County's Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (hereinafter referred to as the JCPC) and (hereinafter referred to as the Sponsoring Agency).

The DPS, the County, the JCPC and the Sponsoring Agency do mutually agree as follows:

### Payment to Sponsoring Agency

All parties agree that services will be delivered as described in the approved JCPC Program Agreement and that JCPC funds will be disbursed in an amount not to exceed the amount \$\_\_\_\_\_ for the term of this agreement, unless amended by an approved JCPC Program Agreement Revision.

### **Availability of Funds:**

All parties to this Agreement agree and understand that the payment of the sums specified in this JCPC Program Agreement budget is dependent and contingent upon and subject to the appropriation, allocation, and availability of funds for this purpose to the DPS.

### Responsibilities of the Parties

DPS shall:

- 1. Disburse funds monthly to County Governments, for payment to the Sponsoring Agency, from the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) fund appropriation by the General Assembly;
- 2. Reserve the right to suspend payment to the County for any non-compliance by the Sponsoring Agency with any reporting requirements set forth in the JCPC Policy and Procedures;
- 3. Notify in writing the County and Sponsoring Agency immediately if payments are suspended and again once payments resume;
- 4. Pay only for work as described in the JCPC Program Agreement provided by the Sponsoring Agency and approved subcontractors;
- 5. Provide technical assistance, orientation and training to the Sponsoring Agency, the County and the JCPC;
- 6. Monitor Sponsoring Agency's JCPC funded program(s) in accordance with JCPC Policy 3. Operations: Program Oversight and Monitoring; and
- 7. Notify parties entering into this Agreement of all due dates in a timely manner in order for reports to be submitted by the established due date.

### The Sponsoring Agency shall:

- 1. Comply with all laws, ordinances, codes, rules, regulations, and licensing requirements that are applicable to the conduct of its business, including those of Federal, State, and local agencies having jurisdiction and/or authority;
- 2. Comply with all Federal and State laws relating to equal employment opportunity;
- Keep as confidential and not divulge or make available to any individual or organization without the prior written
  approval of the DPS any information, data, instruments, documents, studies or reports given to or prepared or
  assembled by the Sponsoring Agency under this Agreement;
- 4. Acknowledge that in receiving, storing, processing or otherwise dealing with any confidential information it will safeguard and not further disclose the information except as otherwise provided in this Agreement;
- 5. Comply with the Juvenile Crime Prevention Policy and Procedures established by the DPS and the North Carolina Administrative Procedures:
- Secure local match as required, pursuant to 14B NCAC 11B.0105, for the approved JCPC funds;
- Create and adopt individualized guidelines specific to the funded program, while also adhering to JCPC Policy and Procedures established by DPS for all JCPC funded programs and for the specific program type for which they receive funding;
- 8. Ensure that state funds received are spent in accordance with the approved JCPC Program Agreement and be accountable for the legal and appropriate expenditure of those state funds;
- 9. Maintain reports, records, and other information to properly document services rendered and outcomes; also maintain an ability to send and receive electronic communication;
- 10. Have the capacity to use DPS electronic, internet-based system for tracking clients served;
- 11. Use generally accepted accounting procedures that guarantee the integrity of the expenditure of JCPC funds, maintain reports, records, and other information to properly account for the expenditure of all State funds provided to the Sponsoring Agency;
- 12. Receive from the North Carolina Division of Revenue a refund of all sales and use taxes paid by them in the performance of the JCPC Program Agreement, pursuant to N.C.G.S. §105-164.14(c); and exclude all refundable sales and use taxes from all reportable expenditures before the expenses are entered in their reimbursement reports:
- 13. Submit JCPC Program Agreement Revisions, Third Quarter Accounting, Final Accounting and annual detailed check ledgers to the JCPC. These reports must be in accordance with the submission process as outlined in the JCPC Policy and Procedures established by DPS and with the due dates established by DPS;
- 14. Make personnel, reports, records and other information available to DPS, the County, the JCPC, and/or the State Auditor for oversight, monitoring and evaluation purposes;
- 15. Submit any other information requested by the JCPC, County or DPS;
- 16. Be responsible for the performance of all subcontractors as described in the JCPC Program Agreement;
- 17. Indemnifies and holds harmless DPS, the State of North Carolina, the County and any of their officers, agents and employees, from any claims of third parties arising out of any act or omission of the Sponsoring Agency in connection with the performance of the JCPC Program Agreement;
- 18. Receive permission and budgetary approval from DPS prior to using the JCPC Program Agreement as a part of any news release or commercial advertising and acknowledge DPS funding in partnership with the County;
- 19. Comply with DPS trainings and requirements regarding the United States Department of Justice national standards to prevent, detect, and respond to prison rape under the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA);

Reference: 14B; Chapter 11; Subchapter B, and in compliance with JCPC Policy 2: Operations: Program Operational Requirements

### **Sponsoring Agency Contractor(s)/Subcontractors**

- 22. Ensure that all subcontractors provide all information necessary to comply with the standards set forth in the JCPC Program Agreement; and
- 23. Be deemed an independent contractor in the performance of services described in the JCPC Program Agreement and as such shall be wholly responsible for the services to be performed and for the supervision of its employees. The Sponsoring Agency represents that it has, or shall secure at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services as described in the JCPC Program Agreement. Such employees shall not be employees of, or have any individual contractual relationship with, DPS;

### The JCPC shall:

- 1. Ensure the Sponsoring Agency uses JCPC funds for only the purposes DPS has approved in JCPC Program Agreement or JCPC Program Agreement Revision(s);
- 2. Comply with the Juvenile Crime Prevention Policy and Procedures established by DPS and the North Carolina Administrative Code; N.C.G.S. §143B-801(a);143B-602;143B-851
- 3. Review and locally approve Program Agreement Revisions received from the Sponsoring Agency and submit to the County in a timely manner;
- 4. Review and locally approve Third Quarter Accounting forms and submit to the County in order to meet the due date established by DPS:
- 5. Submit any other information requested by the County or DPS; and
- 6. Monitor the Sponsoring Agency's currently funded JCPC program(s) in accordance with JCPC Policy 3. Operations: Program Oversight and Monitoring

Reference: 14B NCAC 11B.0202 and JCPC Policy 1, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11.

#### The County shall:

1. Ensure the Sponsoring Agency is appropriately licensed, and either a public agency or a 501 (c) 3 private non-

- profit organization;
- 2. Use JCPC funds only for the purposes DPS has approved in program agreements or program agreement revisions:
- 3. Disburse JCPC funds monthly and oversee JCPC funds to the Sponsoring Agency in accordance with 14B NCAC 11B.0108
- 4. Comply with the Juvenile Crime Prevention Policy and Procedures established by DPS and the North Carolina Administrative Procedures:
- 5. Review and locally approve Program Agreement Revisions received from the Sponsoring Agency for final approval from DPS; and
- 6. Review and locally approve Third Quarter and Final Accounting forms for the JCPC and all JCPC funded programs according to the procedures and due dates established by DPS.

**Headings:** The Section and Paragraph headings in these General Terms and Conditions are not material parts of the agreement and should not be used to construe the meaning thereof.

Choice of Law: The validity of this Program Agreement and any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties to this Program Agreement, are governed by the laws of North Carolina. The parties, by signing this Program Agreement, agree and submit, solely for matters concerning this Program Agreement, to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of North Carolina and agree, solely for such purpose, that the exclusive venue for any legal proceedings shall be Wake County, North Carolina. The place of this Program Agreement and all transactions and agreements relating to it, and their situs and forum, shall be Wake County, North Carolina, where all matters, whether sounding in Program Agreement or tort, relating to the validity, construction, interpretation, and enforcement shall be determined.

**Assignment:** No assignment of the Sponsoring Agency's obligations or the Sponsoring Agency's right to receive payment hereunder shall be permitted. However, upon written request approved by the issuing purchasing authority, DPS may:

- (a) Forward the Sponsoring Agency's payment check(s) directly to any person or entity designated by the Program Manager, or
- (b) Include any person or entity designated by Sponsoring Agency as a joint payee on the Sponsoring Agency's payment check(s).

In no event shall such approval and action obligate DPS or County Government to anyone other than the Sponsoring Agency and the Sponsoring Agency shall remain responsible for fulfillment of all Program Agreement obligations.

**Beneficiaries:** Except as herein specifically provided otherwise, this Program Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors. It is expressly understood and agreed that the enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Program Agreement, and all rights of action relating to such enforcement, shall be strictly reserved to DPS, the County Government, and the Sponsoring Agency. Nothing contained in this document shall give or allow any claim or right of action whatsoever by any other third person. It is the express intention of DPS and County Government that any such person or entity, other than DPS or the County Government, or the Sponsoring Agency receiving services or benefits under this Program Agreement shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only.

### **Property Rights**

**Intellectual Property** - All deliverable items produced pursuant to this Program Agreement are the exclusive property of DPS. The Sponsoring Agency shall not assert a claim of copyright or other property interest in such deliverables.

**Physical Property** - the Sponsoring Agency agrees that it shall be responsible for the proper custody and care of any property purchased for or furnished to it for use in connection with the performance of this Program Agreement and will reimburse DPS for loss of, or damage to, such property. At the termination of this Program Agreement, the Sponsoring Agency, County Government, and JCPC shall follow the guidelines for disposition of property set forth in Administrative Code and JCPC policy.

#### **Disbursements and Internal Controls**

#### **Reversion of Unexpended Funds**

Any remaining unexpended JCPC funds DPS disbursed to the County for the Sponsoring Agency must be refunded/reverted back to DPS at the close of fiscal year or upon termination of this Agreement.

### **Accountability for Funds**

### **Audit Requirement - Local Government or Public Authority Requirements**

Local Government or Public Authorities in accordance with N.C.G.S. §159-34 must have an audit performed in conformity with generally accepted auditing standards. The audit shall evaluate the performance of a unit of local government or public authority with regard to compliance with all applicable Federal and State agency regulations. This audit, combined with the audit of financial accounts, shall be deemed to be the single audit described by the "Federal Single Audit Act of 1984".

**Audit Requirement – Non-Governmental Entities:** An audit, when required by law, or requested by the County or DPS shall be performed in conformity with generally accepted auditing standards and audits of non-governmental entities, both for-profit and not-for-profit, and must meet the requirements of OMB Circular A-133. At a minimum, the required report shall include the financial statements prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, all disclosures in the public interest required by law, and the auditor's opinion and comments relating to financial statements. The audit report must be submitted to the State Auditor's office as required by law, to the County and DPS, and to other recipients as appropriate within nine (9) months after the end of your program's fiscal year.

### **Oversight**

Access to Persons and Records: The State Auditor shall have access to persons and records as a result of all Program Agreements entered into by State agencies or political subdivisions in accordance with N.C.G.S. §147-64.7. Additionally, as the State funding authority, DPS shall have access to persons and records as a result of all Program Agreements entered into by State agencies or political subdivisions.

Record Retention: Records shall not be destroyed, purged or disposed of without the express written consent of DPS. State basic records retention policy requires all records to be retained for a minimum of five years or until all audit exceptions have been resolved, whichever is longer. If the Program Agreement is subject to Federal policy and regulations, record retention may be longer than five years since records must be retained for a period of three years following submission of the final Federal Financial Status Report, if applicable, or three years following the submission of a revised final Federal Financial Status Report. Also, if any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit, disallowance action, or other action involving this Program Agreement has been started before expiration of the five-year retention period described above, the records must be retained until completion of the action and resolution of all issues which arise from it, or until the end of the regular five-year period described above, whichever is later.

# No Overdue Tax Debt -Not for profit organizations ONLY will comply with this section. Form must be attached to the Program Agreement upon submission.

The Sponsoring Agency shall be responsible for the payment of all State, local, and Federal taxes. Consistent with N. C.G.S. § 143C-6-23 (c), not for profit organizations shall file with DPS and the County a written statement completed by that Sponsoring Agency 's board of directors or other governing body, stating that the Sponsoring Agency does not have any overdue tax debts, as defined by N.C.G.S. 105-243.1, at the Federal, State, or local level. This written statement, *Certification of No Overdue Tax Debts*, shall be completed by the Sponsoring Agency and attached to the Program Agreement upon submission.

# Conflict of Interest –Not for profit organizations ONLY will comply with this section. Form must be attached to the Program Agreement upon submission.

Consistent with the N.C.G.S. §143C-6-23 (b), not for profit organizations shall file with DPS and the County a copy of that Sponsoring Agency's policy addressing conflicts of interest that may arise involving the Sponsoring Agency's management employees and the members of its board of directors or other governing body. The policy shall address situations in which any of these individuals may directly or indirectly benefit, except as the Sponsoring Agency's employees or members of its board or other governing body, from the Sponsoring Agency's disbursing of State funds and shall include actions to be taken by the Sponsoring Agency or the individual, or both to avoid conflicts of interest and the appearance of impropriety. The policy shall be filed before the County or DPS may disburse any funds. The Sponsoring Agency shall also complete the DPS Conflict of Interest Policy Statement (*Form DPS 13 001*) and attach the statement and the Sponsoring Agency's policy addressing conflicts of interest to the JCPC Program Agreement upon submission.

**Amendment**: This Agreement may not be amended orally or by performance. Any amendment must be requested by the Sponsoring Agency through submission of a JCPC

Program Agreement Revision and executed by duly authorized representatives of DPS, the County Government, JCPC and Sponsoring Agency.

**Severability:** In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction holds that a provision or requirement of this Program Agreement violates any applicable law, each such provision or requirement shall continue to be enforced to the extent it is not in violation of law or is not otherwise unenforceable and all other provisions and requirements of this Program Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

**Termination for Cause:** If, through any cause, the Sponsoring Agency shall fail to fulfill its obligations under this Program Agreement in a timely and proper manner, DPS shall have the right to terminate this Program Agreement by giving written notice to the Sponsoring Agency and specifying the effective date thereof. In that event, all finished or unfinished deliverable items prepared by the Sponsoring Agency under this Program Agreement shall, at the option of DPS, become its property and the Sponsoring Agency shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such materials, minus any payment or compensation previously made. Notwithstanding the foregoing provision, the Sponsoring Agency shall not be relieved of liability to DPS for damages sustained by DPS by virtue of the Sponsoring Agency's breach of this agreement, and DPS may withhold any payment due the Sponsoring Agency for the purpose of setoff until such time as the exact amount of damages due DPS from such breach can be determined. The filing of a petition for bankruptcy by the Sponsoring Agency shall be an act of default under this Program Agreement.

**Termination without Cause:** DPS, the County Government, or the Sponsoring Agency may terminate this Agreement at any time and without cause by giving at least thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other. If this Program Agreement is terminated by DPS as provided herein, the Sponsoring Agency shall be reimbursed on a pro rata basis for services satisfactorily provided to DPS under this Program Agreement prior to Program Agreement termination.

**Waiver of Default:** Waiver by DPS of any default or breach in compliance with the terms of this Program Agreement by the Sponsoring Agency shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent default or breach and shall not be construed to be modification of the terms of this Program Agreement unless stated to be such in writing, signed by an authorized representative of DPS, County Government, the JCPC and the Sponsoring Agency and attached to the Program Agreement.

**Force Majeure:** Neither party shall be deemed to be in default of its obligations hereunder if and so long as it is prevented from performing such obligations by any act of war, hostile foreign action, nuclear explosion, riot, strikes, civil insurrection, earthquake, hurricane, tornado, or other catastrophic natural event or act of God.

**Survival of Promises:** All promises, requirements, terms, conditions, provisions, representations, guarantees, and warranties contained herein shall survive the Program Agreement expiration or termination date unless specifically provided otherwise herein, or unless superseded by applicable Federal or State statutes of limitation.

To Whom It May Concern—

The North Carolina Administrative Office of the Courts (NCAOC) is sending you this notice because you have been identified as a state or local government entity that may receive court costs or fines imposed in criminal and infraction cases. Effective December 1, 2017, government entities "directly affected" by any waiver or remission of court costs and fines are entitled to notice and the opportunity to be heard, through counsel, on any such waiver or remission.<sup>90</sup>

By this notice, you are advised that at any setting of criminal court, a court may waive or remit costs and fines. Below is a link to the NCAOC's online criminal calendars webpage, searchable by county.

If an entity chooses to send counsel to a session of criminal court, counsel shall notify the courtroom clerk that he or she is present and requests the opportunity to be heard on any waiver.

Any entity wishing to register a standing objection or a lack of objection to waivers/remissions may do so by completing the form on the back of this notice, by and through counsel for the entity, and returning it by mail or email. The 2015 legislature modified GS 159-28 (d2) (local governments) and 115C-441(d2) (local school administrative units) to allow the Local Government Commission (LGC) to adopt rules to address the execution of the pre-audit and disbursement process related to electronic transactions for local government and local school administrative units. The new pre-audit and disbursement rules were effective as of November 1, 2017, and exist as part of the North Carolina Administrative Code (20 NCAC 03.0409 and 20 NCAC 03.0410).

Units of government can now be exempt from the pre-audit certificate and disbursement certificate requirements on electronic transactions <u>if they follow the requirements as detailed in the new administrative code rules</u>. The purpose of this memorandum is to briefly outline the requirements that will allow local governments to take advantage of these changes for electronic transactions utilizing the following:

- (1) charge cards;
- (2) credit cards;
- (3) debit cards;
- (4) gas cards;
- (5) procurement cards; or
- (6) electronic funds transfers

It is important to note that <u>none of these rule changes exempt a unit of government from</u> <u>going through the pre-audit process</u>; the rules only exempt a unit from affixing the certificate of pre-audit on electronic transactions IF the unit abides by the rules set forth in the administrative code.

# Requirements to Take Advantage of Pre-Audit Certificate Exemption on Electronic Obligations

There are multiple steps a unit of government must take in order to take advantage of the rule change for electronic **obligations**. These steps are:

- 1. The unit's governing board shall adopt a resolution authorizing the unit to engage in electronic payments as defined by G.S. 159-28 or G.S. 115C-441 (see Addendum A for a sample resolution).
- 2. The unit's board must adopt policies and procedures for electronic obligations or delegate the authority and responsibility for writing those policies and procedures to the finance officer.
- 3. The written policy must outline the basic procedures for pre-auditing obligations incurred by electronic transactions. The written policy and any procedures developed by the finance officer must provide sufficient internal controls over the obligation process, which must include the following:
  - a. Ensure that there is an appropriate budget ordinance or project/grant ordinance appropriation authorizing the obligation;
  - b. ensure that sufficient monies remain within the appropriation to cover the amount that is expected to be paid out during the current fiscal year if accounted for in the budget ordinance, or to cover the entire amount if accounted for in a project or grant ordinance.
  - c. Record the amount of the transaction in the unit's encumbrance system.
- 4. The unit must provide training to all personnel about the written policy and the procedures that must be followed before undertaking an electronic transaction.
- 5. If a governmental unit is not already doing so, the unit of government must present to its governing board at least quarterly a budget to actual statement by fund that includes budgeted accounts, actual payments made, amounts encumbered (including electronic obligations) and the amount of the budget that is unobligated.
- 6. The unit's written policy and procedures must include a method to track obligations, commonly called an encumbrance system. The system can be manual or maintained as part of the unit's accounting system or any combination thereof.

# Requirements to Take Advantage of Disbursement Certificate Exemption on Electronic Payments

Likewise there are multiple steps a unit of government must take in order to take advantage of the rule change for electronic **payments**. These steps are:

1. The unit's governing board shall adopt a resolution authorizing the unit to engage in electronic payments as defined by G.S. 159-28 or G.S. 115C-441 (see Addendum A for a sample resolution).

- 2. The unit's board must adopt policies and procedures for electronic payments or delegate the authority and responsibility for writing those policies and procedures to the finance officer.
- 3. The unit must adopt a written policy outlining basic procedures for disbursing public funds electronically. The written policy must provide sufficient internal controls to ensure the following:
  - a. ensure that the amount claimed is payable;
  - b. ensure that there is an appropriate budget ordinance or project/grant ordinance appropriation authorizing the expenditure;
  - c. ensure that sufficient monies remain within the appropriation to cover the amount that is due to be paid out during the current fiscal year if accounted for in the budget ordinance, or to cover the entire amount if accounted for in a project/grant ordinance; and
  - d. ensure that the unit has sufficient cash to cover the payment.

Some of the questions we have received about this new process, along with our responses, are noted below.

- Q Does the board's delegation of authority to the finance officer to develop the policies and procedures need to be in writing?
- A. Yes.
- Q. My unit already publishes monthly budget-to-actual financial reports on its website will these suffice for the requirement to provide these reports to the board?
- A. We believe so if they meet all the other requirements listed.

While these changes do not address all the business challenges that local governments face in operating in an increasingly electronic environment, they should provide a way for entities to more easily operate within the requirements of the General Statutes in this particular area.

- 3. In accordance with N.C. G.S. 159-28.1, the use of facsimile signing of checks is hereby authorized for the Finance Officer and Chairman. The signature devices are to be kept under security by the Finance Officer, who shall be bonded and along with the sureties of the official bond are liable for any illegal, improper, or unauthorized use of them.
- 4. An exception to the dual signature requirement is allowed for the disbursement of funds through the Public School Building Capital Fund maintained with the state of North Carolina which will require only the Finance Officer's signature for reimbursement of state approved projects.

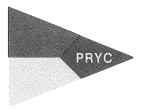

# NORTH CAROLINA CAMDEN COUNTY

The Lease Agreement is entered into on this the <u>ZO</u> day of August, 2013, by and between Camden County, a body politic and political subdivision of the State of North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as "Lessor" or "County," and the Pasquotank River Yacht Club, Inc., a North Carolina non-profit corporation, with its principal offices being located in Elizabeth City, North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as "Lessee" or "Club."

### **RECITALS**

- 1. Since at least 1977, Lessee has leased from County a tract of real estate, situate in Courthouse Township on the Pasquotank River, adjacent to the Causeway which tract of property is more particularly described hereinafter.
- 2. In the course of this leasehold arrangement, Lessee has made significant improvements to the property, and by virtue of subleasing space to vessel owners has added to the tax base of Lessor.
- 3. All pre-existing written lease arrangements have expired although Lessee has continued to occupy the premises, with the permission of Lessor, and paid rent under the terms of a lease under date of July 16, 1990.
- 4. Both parties desire to continue the lease arrangement, as in their best interest, and to memorialize the same in this written agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter expressed, it is agreed between the parties as follows:

### SECTION ONE TERM

Lessor does lease to Lessee for a term of five (5) years from date that certain tract of real property, including riparian access, located in Courthouse Township, and more particularly described as follows:

That certain tract of land containing .77 acres, more or less, and known as Lot 15, of the Division of the C.H. Robinson – Camden County land made amongst the grandchildren of C.H. Robinson under and by virtue of his Will, which was admitted to probate in Pasquotank County, North Carolina, on December 4, 1930, and lying on the northerly side of and abutting the state highway leading from Elizabeth City to Camden County (U.S. 158) and bounding on the north and west by the Pasquotank River; bounded on the east lands of now or formerly belonging to Elizabeth H. Strubing; bounded on the south by the aforesaid highway; and also bounded on the west by Lot No. 14 of said division, and being particularly described according to a survey made thereof by J.E. McGowan, under date of May 1956, a copy of which survey entitled "Map showing O.S. right – part Lot No. 15, C.H. Robinson Land of Camp Mfg. Co., Inc., Camden County – North Carolina," which is attached to the deed from Union Camp Corporation, to the Board of Camden County Commissioners, recorded in the Public Registry of Camden County.

The above described land is the same as that tract of land conveyed to Union Bag – Camp Paper Corporation, a predecessor to Union Camp Corporation, by deed dated June 27, 1956, recorded in the Public Registry of Camden County, in Deed Book 36, at Page 250.

## SECTION TWO RENT

For the exclusive use and occupancy of the above described premises, Lessee shall pay to Lessor an annual lease payment on or before May  $1^{\rm st}$  of 2014 and each subsequent calendar year thereafter the sum of \$3,600, until the expiration of this lease and any amendments thereto.

## SECTION THREE QUIET ENJOYMENT

Lessee, upon payment of the rental obligation, and subject to all other terms and covenants of this lease, on Lessee's part to be kept, shall quietly have and enjoy the leased premises during the term of this lease without hinderance or interference by any person. Lessee, for its self, successors and assigns, agrees that Lessee shall have continuance, peaceful, uninterrupted and exclusive possession and quiet enjoyment of the entire premises during the term of this lease.

At present, the property is properly zoned for the use being made of the same by Lessee and Lessor has no immediate or foreseeable plans to rezone the property in such manner as to impair or destroy the current use. However, in the event the property is rezoned, Lessee shall have the benefit of the Camden County ordinances, and the law of North Carolina, relating to non-conforming uses, which will, if complied with, allow use to the same extent as is now enjoyed.

To this end, Lessor shall have no control or influence over the corporate structure of Lessee.

## SECTION FOUR SUBLETTING OR ASSIGNMENT

Lessee shall not sublet or assign any rights in and to this lease without the specific written permission of Lessor. Provided, however, Lessee may sublet vessel berths with any income being derived therefrom remaining its sole and exclusive property. Such rentals shall not be deemed a violation of this lease, provided Lessee shall remain responsible to Lessor for any violation of law or damaged caused by such boat berthing arrangements.

### SECTION FIVE TERMINATION PRIOR TO EXPIRATION OF TERM

Lessor, may at its sole election, terminate this lease in its entirety and have no further responsibility to Lessee should the Lessee's corporate charter be suspended or dissolved, Lessee petitions for bankruptcy, execution on a judgment is made against Lessee, or a receiver is appointed. Likewise, the lease may be terminated in its entirety for any material violation of the terms of this lease, which shall include, but not be limited to, failure to timely pay rent.

Lessor shall give Lessee written notice of any material violation and Lessee shall have ten (10) days from the date of said notification to cure the violation complained of. Thereafter, if the violation has not been remedied, the lease shall cease.

## SECTION SIX INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

Lessee shall maintain insurance, both hazard and liability, on the leased premises in such fashion as to make Lessor a co-insured. Upon request, Lessee shall properly furnish to Lessor proof of the same. The amounts of coverage shall be subject to approval by Lessor. Failure to maintain insurance is a material and substantial breach of this agreement.

Regardless of the insurance requirements, Lessee does hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless Lessor from any and all claims, demands, and judgments, arising from its leasehold, including reasonable attorney's fees in defense.

## SECTION SEVEN CONDEMNATION

In the event of condemnation, all proceeds paid by the condemning body shall by paid to the Lessor unless the condemnation results in the destruction or rendering useless of any improvements made to the property by Lessee. In such event, the proceeds shall be prorated between Lessee and Lessor in such manner as to fairly compensate Lessee for its loss. In the event of condemnation, which in Lessee's discretion impairs its use, Lessee may immediately terminate this lease without further obligation.

### SECTION EIGHT OPTION TO RENEW

Lessee is granted with this lease the option to renew for an additional term of five (5) years provided written notice is given to Lessor not less than ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of this lease. A renewal shall be on the same terms and conditions set forth herein, except that the annual lease payment shall be renegotiated between Lessee and Lessor following submission of a request to renew by Lessee. Additionally, an option to renew shall be void if at the time Lessee seeks to renew there is any existing breach of any of the terms of the existing lease.

## SECTION NINE MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENTS

All maintenance of the leased premises is the sole and exclusive responsibility, at its expense, of Lessee. This includes but is not limited to parking, access, driveways, buildings, piers, boat slips, steps, decks, pilings, and the like. At the termination of this lease, for any reason, or at its normal expiration, all permanent improvements shall be the sole and exclusive property of the county.

### SECTION TEN LAWFUL COMPLIANCE

Lessee shall at all times occupy and use the subject premises in strict compliance with all local, state and federal laws, ordinances and regulations. This includes environmental laws and regulations. In the event any lawful authority imposes a fine, penalty, or sanction, it shall be the sole and exclusive responsibility of Lessee to promptly pay the same and to undertake such remedies as are necessary to come in full

compliance. Failure to abide this provision is a material and substantial breach of this agreement.

In the event Lessor is also cited, as the result of Lessee's activities or inactivity in this regard, Lessee shall be solely responsible for defense of Lessor and the payment any fines, fees, or sanctions imposed.

## SECTION ELEVEN SIGNATURES

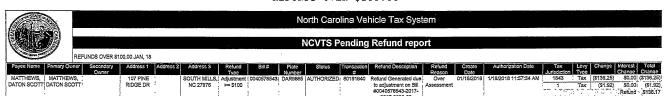

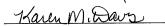

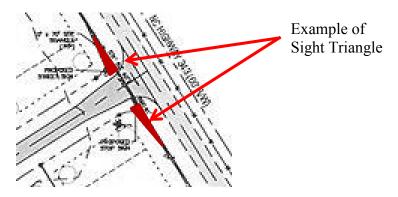

Cathleen Saunders questioned the lot size of lot 10, asking why it was slightly less than 40,000 sqft. Mr. Robey stated he could adjust the back lot lines either of lot 9 or lot 11 to make lot 10 meet the 40,000 sqft. Mr. Robey noted that the front lot lines are required to have 25 foot frontage along the road. Ms. Saunders further asked if the lot areas included the wetlands. Mr. Robey replied yes they did.

Vice Chairman Patricia Delano asked what the setbacks for houses on the inside of the subdivision would be, feet from the road. Mr. Robey responded that they would be 50 feet or more with the exception of the lots which contain wetlands to the rear of the lots. Those lots may be very close or right at the 50 foot minimum setbacks due to the location of the wetlands and the need to place the septic systems / drainfields along the sides of those houses.

Cathleen Saunders asked if the side setbacks in the subdivision were the same as on NC 343. Dan Porter replied that the side setbacks are 10 feet but that they have to add 25 feet to that.

Steven Bradshaw asked if that was what is referred to as a sight triangle. Dan Porter replied that it was not and showed on the map where the sight triangles were, which are in the corners of the corner lots (see below).



Mr. Porter added that with regard to the setbacks for properties along major arterial highways / roads, side setbacks require an additional 25 feet which makes the side setbacks for such properties a minimum of 35 feet.

Mr. Porter stated that the additional 25 feet was not addressed for lots 1 and 16 so they would have to be re-visited.

Vice Chairman Patricia Delano asked about the front setbacks of lots 15 and 16, wondering if it were possible to situate the houses on those 2 lots closer to the roadway so that they would be farther away from the neighboring properties to the rear of those lots. 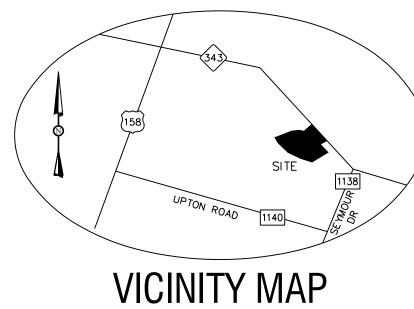

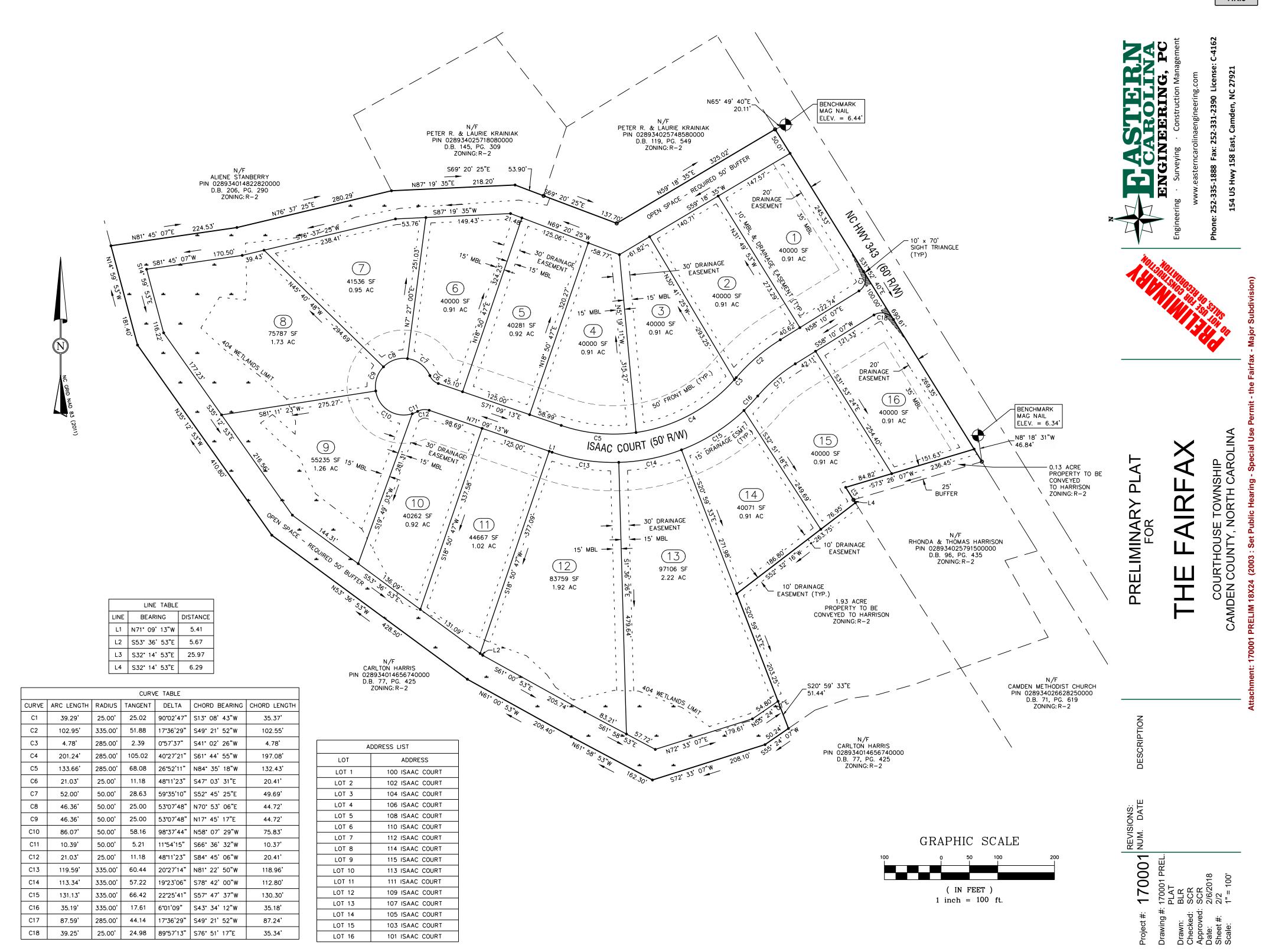
