SUMMARY:

The current County Web site lacks a professional design and layout and residents and other customers frequently report difficulty navigating through the site and finding information. The County site was created and is currently hosted by the Ohio-based company E-The contract agreement between Camden and E-Gov is currently pending a one-year renewal (November 1, 2012 thru December 31, 2013).

Staff believes that the County's Web presence and levels of customer satisfaction would be improved by allowing the agreement with E-Gov to expire and having the site redesigned and hosted by a professional Web site developer.

Staff has met with a local Web site design firm, Top Hat Computing, who has an extensive amount of experience in designing and hosting local government Web sites. Based upon current fees paid to E-Gov for hosting services, staff has determined that the County would realize an annual savings of \$1,500 through the use of Top Hat Computing.

RECOMMENDATION:

The County Manager recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve retaining the services of Top Hat Computing for a professional redesign of the County Web site and future hosting services.

County Web Site Current Costs

Current list of expenses we pay for our website:

- \$125 annually for our domain name
- \$1800 annually for hosting via E-Gov.
- Web redesigns would be \$5000 + with Egov, should we want to do so.

Projected expenses if we moved to Top Hat Computing:

- \$125 annually for our domain name
- \$300 annually for hosting via Top Hat
- An initial \$2500 Web redesign fee (based on 50 hrs of work)

Anticipated cost savings:

- County will save \$1500 in annual Web hosting fees
- Payback period for Top Hat Computing redesign costs is 1 ½ years

Issues with Current Web Site Design

- Navigation menus are cumbersome and difficult to use
- Lacks professional design and County branding (i.e. use of professional graphics, lack of County logo/branding and color palette, consistent look and feel across departments, etc.)
- Residents, customers, and even staff frequently report difficulty finding information they are looking for due to poor layout and design

Pursuant to your request, **G E T Solutions, Inc.** is pleased to submit this proposal for providing the required Construction Materials Testing Quality Assurance services at the above referenced project site. This proposal presents our understanding of the project, our project approach and scope of work, our unit rates, and the estimated cost for our services.

Site and Project Description

The project site is located along the east side of US Hwy 17 in Camden County, North Carolina. More specifically, the proposed construction areas are located slightly north of the Camden County Waste Water Spray Field and south of Ponderosa Road. The construction area generally extends from US Hwy 17 to approximately 2300 feet east and from the proposed entrance roadway to approximately 1800 to 1900 feet north.

The development at this site is to consist of constructing a new industrial park that will focus on environmental friendly facilities. The industrial park will include a total of nineteen (19) commercial parcels, constructed wetlands at the each corner of an existing pond, a new north bound right hand turn lane along US Hwy 17, and three new roadways having a total length of approximately 6300 feet. It is our understanding that the existing utility infrastructure associated with this project, including new water and sewer piping were installed in a previous stage of this project. Furthermore, at this time our services have been requested to include the necessary field engineering and materials testing services for the construction of the proposed roadway alignments in accordance with the NCDOT's Quality Management System (QMS).

The widening of US Hwy 17 (north bound right hand turn lane) will extend from the south edge of the proposed Industrial Park entrance roadway to approximately 300 feet south. The entrance roadway, identified as ECO Park Boulevard, will be divided by means of a traffic island and will extend from US Hwy 178 to approximately 2350 feet east. The westernmost roadway intersecting ECO Park Boulevard will be a two-way non divided street extending from the entrance roadway to approximately 2100 feet north and is identified as Opportunity Drive. Finally, the easternmost roadway that intersects ECO Park Boulevard will also be a two-way non divided street extending from the east end of the entrance roadway to approximately 1850 feet north and is identified as Solar Way.

The soil conditions occurring within the proposed roadway alignments have been reported to be organic and/or potentially unsuitable for support of the proposed pavement section and/or the design traffic loading criteria. Accordingly, the contract documents have included an over excavation depth of approximately 12 to 18 inches and shall be performed as determined necessary during the subgrade evaluation procedures. Where required, the over excavation will extend 2 feet beyond the proposed pavement edge and with a finished grade coinciding with the finished grade of the pavement edge and a slope of 4% to provide positive drainage to the perimeter drainage swales.

The proposed pavement section will consist of 8 inches of Aggregate Base Course (ABC) materials overlain by 3 inches of bituminous intermediate course asphalt mix (I-19b) followed by 2 inches of bituminous surface course asphalt mix (S-9.5b). Finally, the ABC materials are to extend at least 12 inches beyond the pavement edges.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF SERVICES

It is our understanding that our services are to consist of the Construction Materials Testing services to meet the NCDOT QMS requirements associated with the construction of the new roadways and the US Hwy 17 north bound right hand turn lane. Our services will be performed in support of and in conjunction with the services of the Civil Engineer of Record, and the County of Camden and will generally include to the following tasks:

I. SITEWORK – EARTHWORK:

Observe site stripping and poofrolling of natural subgrade soils to determine their ability to support the proposed pavement sections. More accurately determine the necessary over excavation depth, if required, included in the project bid documents and currently estimated to be on the order of about 12 to 18 inches. Monitor subgrade improvements, if required, within the proposed pavement areas.

- Collecting bulk soil samples and returning them to our laboratory for Standard Proctor (ASTM D 698) and Classification testing (including moisture content, and sieve/gradation testing). These samples will include existing subgrade soils, imported select fill, and imported Aggregate Base Course (ABC) fill materials for use as needed to establish the design grade elevations for the construction areas.
- Performing field density tests in accordance with (ASTM D 2922) to verify degree of compaction for the existing subgrade and imported ABC fill materials used for establishing the design grades for the project site. ABC thickness testing within pavement areas will also be performed.
- Performing field evaluations of the subgrade soils and/or in-place ABC materials prior to placement of the subsequent portion of the pavement section to verify cleanliness, proper thicknesses or depths, smoothness, slope, and/or shape as required in the project documents.
- Maintaining records of all earthwork testing and construction activities including determination of change order quantities, if any.

II. PAVEMENTS:

- Performing field evaluations of the in-place ABC and/or asphalt materials prior to placement of the subsequent portion of the pavement section to verify cleanliness, proper thicknesses or depths, smoothness, slope, and/or shape as required in the project documents.
- Performing field evaluations of the existing roadway pavement surface to verify cleanliness and that leveling course application is placed as needed to attain plan grade and cross slopes.
- Performing asphalt monitoring and testing including asphalt temperature, roller pattern, and density quality assurance. Additionally, collection of tickets and notations of quantities will be performed as well as verification of thickness during paving operations.
- Performing field coring of the as built pavement section and complete laboratory analysis consisting of asphalt core thickness, density, asphalt content, and aggregate gradation.
- Maintaining records of all earthwork testing and construction activities including determination of change order quantities, if any.

All testing services will be performed by a Senior Technician that is a NCDOT-Certified Roadway Technician and/or a Nuclear Gauge Technician, as appropriate for the task being performed. Additionally, all testing services will be performed in conformation to the project specifications referencing the NCDOT Requirements.

FEE FOR SERVICES

G E T Solutions, Inc. will perform the services required to implement the Quality Assurance (QA) portion of NCDOT's Quality Management System (QMS) as requested by McGill Associates, P.A. and has prepared a budget schedule for those activities as shown on Attachment "A." - 2. TESTS AND INSPECTIONS: Client shall cause all tests and inspections of the site, materials and work performed by GET or others to be timely and properly performed in accordance with the plans, specifications and contract documents and GET's recommendations. Emergency Management Interlocal Agreement

SUMMARY:

The attached proposed interlocal agreement between Elizabeth City, Pasquotank County, and Camden County is for the provision of joint emergency management services. The agreement would have the effect of establishing the Central Control Group as well as committing Camden County to providing twenty percent of the Emergency Management annual operating costs. This funding formula is based upon Camden County's population (2010 U.S. Census) as a percentage of the combined population of the three jurisdictions.

If approved, the agreement would become immediately effective and run for a term of three (3) years with an automatic extension of two years unless Elizabeth City and/or Camden County notify Pasquotank County of its intent to withdraw from the agreement.

The County Attorney has reviewed the agreement and found no objections to its form or content..

RECOMMENDATION:

The County Manager recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the attached Emergency Management Interlocal Agreement.

<u>WITNESSETH</u>

THAT, WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute §166A-7 authorizes the forming of joint Emergency Management Agencies between two or more counties and one or more municipalities within the borders of those counties, and

WHEREAS, the CITY and PASQUOTANK and CAMDEN desire to contract for all coordination services as related to Emergency Management; and

WHEREAS, PASQUOTANK, through the Department of Pasquotank-Camden Emergency Management Department, is willing and able to furnish such services on a mutually agreeable cost sharing plan; and

WHEREAS, PASQUOTANK is currently providing these services pursuant to a jointly adopted PASQUOTANK, CAMDEN, CITY Emergency Management Ordinance; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1) TERM AND RENEWAL OF THE AGREEMENT

- a) The initial term of this Agreement shall be for three years commencing July 1, 2012 and ending on June 30, 2015, unless sooner terminated as provided herein.
- b) Following completion of the initial three year term, this Agreement shall automatically be renewed for two years, unless CITY and/or CAMDEN notify PASQUOTANK of its intention to withdraw. Such notice shall be in writing, mailed or delivered to PASQUOTANK no later than ninety (90) days prior to July 1 of the then current year and the withdrawal shall become effective June 30 of the year following the current year, unless otherwise agreed to by PASQUOTANK, CAMDEN and CITY.

2) MANAGEMENT

a) The Emergency Management Department shall be directly managed and operated by Pasquotank County with budget development and funding provided by both counties and the city.

3) PASQUOTANK-CAMDEN-ELIZABETH CITY CONTROL GROUP

- a) <u>Purpose</u> The purpose of the PASQUOTANK, CAMDEN, CITY Control Group, during times of emergencies, is to make timely decisions on urgent matters related to an emergency or disaster situation. They have active presence in the Emergency Operations Center. The Control Group, for purposes of this Interlocal Agreement, is to establish clear communications and consistent coordination regarding emergency management services.
- b) <u>Membership</u> The Control Group shall consist of the same members as identified in the Pasquotank-Camden-Elizabeth City Multi-Hazard Operations Plan, as follows:
 - (1) Pasquotank County Commission Chairman (representing all Commissioners)
 - (2) Camden County Commission Chairman (representing all Commissioners)
 - (3) Mayor of Elizabeth City (representing all Council members)
 - (4) Pasquotank County Manager
 - (5) Camden County Manager
 - (6) City Manager of Elizabeth City
 - (7) Emergency Management Coordinator

4) FINANCIAL/BUDGET

- a) The Pasquotank County Manager, in conjunction with the Control Group, shall prepare a proposed budget each year that identifies Pasquotank-Camden Emergency Management expenses and revenue for the upcoming year. The proposed budget shall be presented to the Elizabeth City Manager and the Camden County Manager no later than April 1 of each year.
- b) Each respective governing body shall approve the budget for Pasquotank-Camden Emergency Management by June 1 of each year. Should a governing body fail to approve the budget by June 1 of a particular year, the County Managers, City Manager, Chairmen and Mayor shall meet within seven (7) days to address any outstanding issues.
- c) The three governmental bodies hereby agree to the following formula for financing the operations of the department:

Pasquotank County 48% Elizabeth City 32% Camden County 20%

- The amount paid shall be net of revenues, which may be received for the operation of the System.
- d) CITY and CAMDEN shall be billed for their portion of the operating expenses on a quarterly basis.

5) INSURANCE

All parties shall maintain in force at all times during the performance of this Agreement, a policy or policies of insurance as follows, and in the minimum limits of liability as stated herein:

- a) Comprehensive general liability, including but not limited to premises, personal injuries, products and completed operations for combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- b) Comprehensive automobile liability, including but not limited to property damage, bodily injury and personal injuries for combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- c) Workers' Compensation covering statutory requirements of the State of North Carolina and Employer's Liability of not less than \$100,000 per occurrence.

6) NOTICES

Notices required under this Agreement shall be delivered personally or by first-class, postage pre-paid mail as follows:

7) GENERAL PROVISIONS

- a) <u>Amendment.</u> This Agreement may be amended or modified only by an instrument in writing signed by all the parties hereto.
- b) <u>Waiver</u>. Any waiver of any terms and conditions hereof must be in writing and signed by the parties hereto. A waiver of any of the terms and conditions hereof shall not be construed as a waiver of any other terms or conditions in this agreement.
- c) <u>Successors and Assigns.</u> This Agreement and the rights, privileges, duties and obligations of the parties hereunder, to the extent assignable or delegable, shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors, permitted assigns, and heirs.
- d) <u>Compliance with Applicable Law.</u> The parties shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations in performing this Agreement.
- e) <u>Heading.</u> The section and paragraph headings are for convenience only and shall not be used to interpret the terms of this Agreement.
- f) <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted under the laws of the State of North Carolina.
- g) <u>Construction of Agreement.</u> The parties agree that each party has fully participated in their review and revision of this Agreement and that any rule of construction to the effect that ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall not apply in the interpretation of this Agreement or any amendment hereto.
- h) <u>Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be executed in three counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same Agreement.
- i) <u>Integration</u>. This Agreement, including the exhibits hereto, shall represent the entire Agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral, between the parties as of the effective date hereof.

MOTION MADE

SUMMARY:

The attached proposed interlocal agreement between Elizabeth City, Pasquotank County, and Camden County is for the provision of public safety communications and emergency dispatch services. The agreement would have the effect of establishing the Central Communications Advisory Board as well as committing Camden to providing twenty percent of the 911 Central Communications annual operating costs. This funding formula is based upon Camden County's population (2010 U.S. Census) as a percentage of the combined population of the three jurisdictions.

If approved, the agreement would become immediately effective and run for a term of three (3) years with an automatic extension of two years unless Elizabeth City and/or Camden County notify Pasquotank County of its intent to withdraw.

The County Attorney has reviewed the agreement and found no objections to its form or content.

RECOMMENDATION:

The County Manager is recommending that the Board of Commissioners approve this interlocal agreement.

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT For Central Communications

PASQUOTANK COUNTY

This AGREEMENT, made and entered into this ______ day of ______2012, by and between the CITY OF ELIZABETH CITY, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter called "CITY"), PASQUOTANK COUNTY and CAMDEN COUNTY, bodies politic and political subdivisions of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter called "PASQUOTANK" and "CAMDEN").

WITNESSETH

THAT, WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute §160A-460, et.seq. provides that any two or more units of local government may cooperate in public safety communications and emergency 9-1-1 dispatch systems, hereinafter "System"; and

WHEREAS, the CITY and PASQUOTANK and CAMDEN desire to contract for all necessary 9-1-1 communications and dispatch services for police, fire, and other emergency services; and

WHEREAS, PASQUOTANK, through its Department of Central Communications, is willing and able to furnish such services on a mutually agreeable cost sharing plan; and

WHEREAS, PASQUOTANK has previously provided these services pursuant to a jointly adopted Resolution; and

WHEREAS, there shall be created a Central Communications Advisory Board as provided herein to assist in the operation of the System.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1) TERM AND RENEWAL OF THE AGREEMENT

- a) The initial term of this Agreement shall be for three years commencing July 1, 2012 and ending on June 30, 2015.
- b) Following completion of the initial three year term, this Agreement shall automatically be renewed for two years, unless CITY and/or CAMDEN notify PASQUOTANK of its intention to withdraw. Such notice shall be in writing, mailed or delivered to PASQUOTANK no later than ninety (90)

days prior to July 1 of the then current year and the withdrawal shall become effective June 30 of the year following the current year, unless otherwise agreed to by PASQUOTANK, CAMDEN and CITY.

2) MANAGEMENT

a) The Central Communications Department shall be directly managed and operated by Pasquotank County with budget development and funding provided by both counties and the City.

3) FORMATION OF CENTRAL COMMUNICATIONS ADVISORY BOARD

- a) PASQUOTANK, CAMDEN and CITY agree to the formation of the Central Communications Advisory Board to assist in formulation of policies and operational processes governing the joint emergency communications and dispatch services. It is understood that the Central Communications Advisory Board serves in an advisory capacity to the governing boards of PASOUOTANK, CAMDEN and CITY.
- b) The intended purpose of the Central Communications Advisory Board is to provide the primary users of the System the means to participate in the generation of policy direction on appropriate matters pertaining to fiscal, operational, service level, equipment, and facilities matters relating to the System. It is agreed that the terms of reference for the Central Communication Advisory Board will be as noted below:

4) CENTRAL COMMUNICATIONS ADVISORY BOARD

- a) Purpose The purpose of the Central Communications Advisory Board is to establish an effective method of communication between the System users and PASQUOTANK. Inherent in the approach is the understanding that the formal structure will enable PASQUOTANK to work with representatives of the user agencies to achieve clear policy direction and consistent coordination regarding emergency dispatch services.
- b) <u>Membership</u> The Central Communications Advisory Board shall serve at the pleasure of his or her appointment authority and consist of six members and three ex-officio members as follows:
 - 1. Three (3) members appointed by the Pasquotank County Board of Commissioners
 - 2. Two (2) members appointed by the Elizabeth City Council
 - 3. One (1) member appointed by the Camden County Board of Commissioners
 - 4. Manager, Pasquotank County (ex-officio, non-voting)
 - 5. Manager, Camden County (ex-officio, non-voting)

6. Manager, City of Elizabeth City (ex-officio, non-voting)

5) FINANCIAL/BUDGET

- a) The Pasquotank County Manager, in conjunction with the Central Communications Advisory Board, shall prepare a proposed budget each year that identifies Central Communications expenses and revenue for the upcoming year. The proposed budget shall be presented to the Elizabeth City Manager and the Camden County Manager no later than April 1 of each year.
- b) Each respective governing body shall take official action on the proposed budget for Central Communications by June 1 of each year. Should a governing body fail to approve the budget by June 1 of a particular year, the County Managers, City Manager, Chairmen and Mayor shall meet within seven (7) days to address any outstanding issues.
- c) The three governmental bodies hereby agree to the following formula for financing the operations of the department:

Pasquotank County 48% Elizabeth City 32% Camden County 20%

The amount paid shall be net of revenues, which may be received for the operation of the System.

d) CITY and CAMDEN shall be billed for their portion of the operating expenses on a quarterly basis.

6) INSURANCE

All parties shall maintain in force at all times during the performance of this Agreement, a policy or policies of insurance as follows, and in the minimum limits of liability as stated herein:

- a) Comprehensive general liability, including but not limited to premises, personal injuries, products and completed operations for combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- b) Comprehensive automobile liability, including but not limited to property damage, bodily injury and personal injuries for combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- c) Workers' Compensation covering statutory requirements of the State of North Carolina and Employer's Liability of not less than \$100,000 per occurrence.

7) NOTICES

Notices required under this Agreement shall be delivered personally or by first-class, postage pre-paid mail as follows:

8) GENERAL PROVISIONS

- a) <u>Amendment.</u> This Agreement may be amended or modified only by an instrument in writing signed by all the parties hereto.
- b) <u>Waiver.</u> Any waiver of any terms and conditions hereof must be in writing and signed by the parties hereto. A waiver of any of the terms and conditions hereof shall not be construed as a waiver of any other terms or conditions in this agreement.
- c) <u>Successors and Assigns.</u> This Agreement and the rights, privileges, duties and obligations of the parties hereunder, to the extent assignable or delegable, shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors, permitted assigns, and heirs.
- d) <u>Compliance with Applicable Law.</u> The parties shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations in performing this Agreement.
- e) <u>Heading.</u> The section and paragraph headings are for convenience only and shall not be used to interpret the terms of this Agreement.
- f) <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted under the laws of the State of North Carolina.
- g) <u>Construction of Agreement.</u> The parties agree that each party has fully participated in their review and revision of this Agreement and that any rule of construction to the effect that ambiguities are to be resolved

- against the drafting party shall not apply in the interpretation of this Agreement or any amendment hereto.
- h) <u>Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be executed in three counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same Agreement.
- i) <u>Integration</u>. This Agreement, including the exhibits hereto, shall represent the entire Agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral, between the parties as of the effective date hereof.

SUMMARY:

The County Manager recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the attached Library Services Interlocal Agreement.

RECOMMENDATION:

The County Manager recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve this agreement for library services.

NORTH CAROLINA CAMDEN and PASQUOTANK COUNTIES

AGREEMENT FOR LIBRARY SERVICES

This Agreement is entered into by and between Camden County, a body politic and a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter Camden) and Pasquotank County, a body politic and a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter Pasquotank), on the day and year hereafter appearing;

RECITALS

- 1. Since at least the 1940's, the parties hereto have cooperated in running a single public library to service the citizens of both counties.
- 2. The library has at all times been located in Elizabeth City, Pasquotank County.
- 3. Camden has yearly made appropriate financial contributions to the library.
- 4. In return for such contributions, Camden residents have had identical access to the library and all library services to the same extent as citizens of Pasquotank.
- 5. Although the library has frequently been known as the Pasquotank-Camden Library in fact, all assets, both real and personal, are the sole and exclusive property of Pasquotank.
- 6. Likewise, all employees of the library are exclusively employees of Pasquotank County excepting only the director, whose position is funded by the East Albemarle Regional Library.
- 7. Camden is now desirous of owning and operating its own library within its borders.
- 8. However, a period of time will elapse before the construction and furnishing of such library can take place.
- 9. In the interim, Camden desires to continue a relationship with Pasquotank that will enable its citizens to continue their enjoyment of the Pasquotank library.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to N.C.G.S. 153A-270 – JOINT LIBRARY; CONTRACTS FOR LIBRARY SERVICES and N.C.G.S. 160A-461 – INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AUTHORIZED and the good and sufficient consideration hereinafter recited, it is agreed between the counties as follows:

LIBRARY SERVICES PROVIDED

Pasquotank, through its library, will provide throughout the duration of this contract and any extension, all library services to the residents of Camden County to the same and identical extent as it does the residents of Pasquotank. This shall include but not be limited to, access to the library facilities, and use of those facilities offered to its patrons, such as periodicals, computers, programs, the loan of books, CD's, video tapes, and the like. Provided, however, Camden citizens will have to abide by the same rules and regulations as Pasquotank citizens regarding timely return of materials, imposition of fines and replacement cost, and use during normal business hours.

FEE FOR SERVICES

In return for the above described services, Camden shall pay to Pasquotank the total sum of \$121,491.00. This sum shall be paid in quarterly installments due on or about the 1st day of April, July, October, and January throughout the term, and any extension, of this contract.

TERM

This agreement shall be effective immediately upon the approval of both county boards of commission and shall run through the current fiscal year, which concludes on June 30, 2013. At the sole option of Camden, this contract may be extended for two additional terms of six months each, provided, Camden gives 30 days notice in writing to the county manager of Pasquotank prior to the expiration of the initial term or any extension.

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES ONLY

This agreement shall be construed in accord with the intention of the parties as a contract for services only. Camden and Pasquotank are not entering into an interlocal agreement as defined N.C.G.S. 160A-464, nor N.C.G.S. 160A-462, a joint agency. Camden will have no other financial responsibilities other than stated herein, nor will it have any authority regarding governance, administration, budgeting, employment, funding, or the like. Pasquotank shall exclusively have the aforementioned privileges and responsibilities. Further, this agreement shall not be construed as giving Camden any ownership interest in the library building or any contents contained therein either

now or supplied hereafter. The same are the sole, separate, and exclusive property of Pasquotank. This includes all books, periodicals, computers, and furnishings.

EARL MEMBERSHIP

Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to effect in any way, the current membership and obligations of both Camden and Pasquotank to the East Albemarle Regional Library.

EXECUTION

By appropriate resolution passed in an open session meeting of each county's board of commission, this contract has been approved, and each county has designated its county manager to sign for his county with binding effect.

Item 5.C- Resolution Establishing the Camden County Library

County Manager Mike Renshaw explained that the resolution legally establishes a library within Camden County, and staff recommends approval.

County Attorney John Morrison mentioned that the Board of Trustees will not just be good citizens, but a working Board, with independent authority; the Board of Commissioners will have sole budget authority, but day to day functioning will be overseen by the Board of Trustees.

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF CAMDEN

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY

WHEREAS, Camden County is the only county in North Carolina without its own library; and

WHEREAS, for many years, without the benefit of ownership or management authority, Camden has supported the Pasquotank-Camden Library, in Pasquotank County, for the use of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the county has provided up to \$160,000.00 per year to Pasquotank County to provide for this library service; and

WHEREAS, the county has carefully considered the benefits of owning its own library for better access of its citizens and more responsible use of the county's financial resources; and

WHEREAS, the county, through the county manager and county attorney, has consulted with officials of the State Public Library System, East Albemarle Regional Library, and the School of Library Science at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill; and

WHEREAS, the county has consulted with the State Library of North Carolina and has applied for and received a Library Services and Technology Act grant in the amount of \$25,000 for conducting a thorough community needs assessment to assure that the Camden County Public Library meets the specific needs of Camden County residents; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners deems it in the best interest of the people of Camden County to establish a Camden County Library pursuant to the authority granted by N.C.G.S. 153A-261, et seq.; and

CREATION

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Camden County does hereby create the Camden County Public Library for the use and benefit of its citizens and does commit to:

- Acquire, as seems most appropriate, from time to time, leaseholds, land, buildings, and facilities to house the Camden County Public Library;
- Equip, operate, and maintain the library making use of modern library technology providing the citizens of Camden County an efficient, ample, accessible library for the 21st Century and beyond;
- Acquiring library materials by purchase, exchange, bequest, gift, or any other lawful method;
 - Appropriate funds annually to carry out the provisions of this Resolution;
- Accept any gift, grant, lease, loan, exchange, bequest or devise of real or personal property for a public library. Such devises, bequests, grants and gifts may be accepted and held subject to any term or condition that may be imposed by the Grantor or Trustor, as by law allowed.
- Provide planning, and administrative support through the county manager, and the county manager's designees, including the county finance officer, county attorney, county personnel director, and the like, whenever such services are determined to be in the best interest of the county library;
- Provide financial funding through the county finance officer after due allocation by the Board of County Commissioners;
- 8. Provide for classification of library employees, and the maintenance thereof, who shall be entitled to all benefits afforded by the county to its employees and obligated to the county personnel policy as the same now exists or may from time to time be amended.

- Maintain all trust funds, building funds, memorial funds, and to prudently invest the same, which funds shall be used exclusively for the purposes for which they were given;
- Provide for the maintenance and repair of any library facility and grounds;
- Continue, for the foreseeable future, as a member of the East Albemarle Regional Authority.

USE

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Camden County Library shall be, in so far as practicable, for the free use of Camden County citizens, subject only to such nominal costs as may be necessary and are routinely assessed by other county libraries in North Carolina, and further subject to the rules and regulations established by the library regarding the use of its books, materials, and facilities.

ESTABLISHMENT OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Camden County does also hereby establish the Camden County Library Board of Trustees, which shall be composed of no more than twelve (12) members, whose term shall be for three (3) years after the initial term (four for three-year terms, four for two-year terms, and four for one-year terms). The Board of Commissioners shall designate and properly appoint the initial members of the Camden County Library Board of Trustees during the first regular meeting scheduled in January 2013.

The Board of County Commissioners shall appoint and reappoint members as vacancies occur. The Board of Commissioners may remove a trustee at any time for incapacity, unfitness, misconduct or neglect of duty. Trustees may not serve more than two consecutive terms. Such limitation on service provides an opportunity for persons who may present new and broader perspectives and the opportunity for representation from all segments of the community.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF TRUSTEES

The library trustees are delegated and granted all powers contained in N.C.G.S. 153A-266, as follows:

- To elect a Chairman from its membership as well as classify and elect such other officers as it deems appropriate for the proper administration of the library and to advise the Camden County Board of Commissioners.
- To formulate and adopt programs, policies, and regulations for the government of the library.
- To make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners concerning the construction and improvement of buildings and other structures for the library system.
 - To supervise and care for the facilities of the library.
- To advise the Board of Commissioners on appointment of a chief librarian or director of library services and, with that individual's advice, to appoint other employees of the library system.
- To establish a schedule of fines and charges for late return of, failure to return, damaged to, and loss of library materials and to take other measures to protect and regulate the use of such materials.
- To participate in preparing the annual budget of the library system, with the county manager and county finance officer, subject to approval of the Camden County Board of Commissioners.
- 8. To extend the privileges and use of the library system to non-residents of the county on such terms and conditions as the trustees may prescribe so as to obtain a favorable status with other public libraries, which would then be more likely to reciprocate the same to residents of Camden County.
- To make an annual report, publicly and in open session, to the Camden County Board of Commissioners on the operation of the library as well as forwarding such report and any additionally required information to the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources as required by N.C.G.S. 125-5.

- 10. To provide such other and further information, reports, and studies as may from time to time be requested by the Camden County Board of Commissioners and to advise the Camden County Board of Commissioners on any other library matters whether specifically addressed herein or not.
- To continue active participation and appropriate cooperation with the East Albemarle Regional Library, so long as Camden County is a participating member.




