On Friday, March 13, 2020, Chief Justice Cheri Beasley entered an order implementing measures designed to curb the spread of COVID-19 and minimize the risk of exposure caused by crowded sessions of court. Consistent with the Chief Justice's order, effective Monday, March 16, superior court and district court proceedings of the First Judicial District will be rescheduled for at least 30 days, with limited exceptions. Additionally, the emergency directive *does not extend filing and other deadlines.*

***The Camden County Clerk of Courts Office will remain open for business at this time.*** However, unless you are required to appear in-person to conduct your business, attorneys and the public are strongly encouraged to use email and telephone to communicate with staff of the Camden County Clerk of Courts Office.
