



DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR CAMDEN COUNTY

WHEREAS, Camden County is currently in the path to experience the effects of Tropical Storm Isaias; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the above-described emergency, I have determined that there is an imminent threat of , or existing conditions have caused or will cause, widespread or severe damage, flooding and significant impacts, including injury, or loss of life or property in our County.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as the Chairman of the Camden County Board of Commissioners under Article 1A of Chapter 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes and the ordinance authorizing a Proclamation of a State of Emergency:

Section 1 – A State of Emergency is hereby declared within Camden County.

Section 2 – I hereby order all County employees, County law enforcement officers, County Fire and EMS departments and Emergency Management personnel subject to our control to cooperate in the enforcement and implementation of the provisions of the Declaration, all applicable local ordinances, State and Federal law, and the Pasquotank-Camden-Elizabeth City Emergency Operations Plan.

Section 3 – I hereby order this declaration (a) to be distributed to the news media and other organizations calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public; (b) to be filed with the Clerk to the Board of Commissioners and (c) to be distributed to others as necessary to ensure proper implementation of this declaration.

Section 4 – At this time, no other restrictions are associated with this declaration.

Section 5 – This declaration shall take effect on August 3, 2020 at 10:00 a.m., and shall remain in effect until modified or rescinded.
